The Bundaberg Lions Club supports the community through fundraising, youth development, and practical humanitarian projects. Operating under the motto "We Serve," the club focus is on addressing local needs while contributing to larger global Australian Lions initiatives such as Disaster Support and Medical Research.

The club manages several ongoing annual community projects to support Bundaberg and Region residents. These include volunteering for the Lions hosted Youth Insearch Camps four times a year to mentor vulnerable young people. Also the club has education bursaries and sponsor the Lions Youth of the Year program for local high school students. Our members also support Meal On Wheels, Sailability, Justice of the Peace activities as volunteers.

Health & Safety Initiatives include the club project of distributing the Emergency Medical Information Book (EMIB) to help emergency services access patient data quickly. The club regularly hold sausage sizzles, social events and volunteer to help other groups in the community groups. Some recent organizations helped include Wheel Chair Basketball, BMX Club, Meal On Wheels, Neighbourhood Watch, Youth Insearch, other Lions clubs, Church of Christ Foster Kids, UPE United Park Eagles Juniors (soccer), Walkervale State School, Bundaberg Special School, Bundaberg High School, Bundaberg Rowing Club, Bundaberg United Church Kids Day Camps during school holidays, Bundaberg Dragon Boat Club, and Bundaberg Gem Club. Crisis Support is offered through Operation Teddy Bear by providing Teddy bears to the local Police Crime Prevention Unit to comfort distressed children. The club has a history of building and maintaining local infrastructure, such as the Rats of Tobruk Memorial, Lions Remembrance Park, and the Peace Pole in Buss Park.

Fundraising activities include sausage sizzles at Bunnings and local fetes, as well as selling Lions Christmas Cakes, puddings, and Lion mints and major fundraisers like the Melbourne Cup Sweep. The club participates in recycling by way of the Containers for Change program and collect used eyeglasses for the "Recycle for Sight" program that sends graded eye glasses to people in need overseas.
